**HISTORIC TRAIN ENGINE STEAMS INTO THE PORT OF LOS ANGELES**

***Engine 3751 Will Take Part in the Port's Rail Festival***

**WHAT:** Historic 1927 Santa Fe 4-8-4 steam locomotive will pull six vintage passenger cars into the Port of Los Angeles under full steam to partake in the Port's Rail Festival. Engine 3751 is the locomotive that pulled the first cars out of Union Station, Los Angeles in 1939, and continued for twenty years with passenger service like the "Chief" and "San Diegan." Engine 3751 was in a number of films including "Polar Express" and "Pearl Harbor." The Rail Festival takes place on Saturday, April 21 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Port of Los Angeles and features six additional rail cars plus the latest in green technology engines. The Rail Festival is part of the Port's Centennial celebrations.
